### **CONSERVATIVE SUN PRAIRIE ATTORNEY SEEKS SEAT ON HIGH COURT**

(Sun Prairie, WI) Sun Prairie Attorney Charlie Schutze has announced today that he has filed his Declaration of Candidacy for the Wisconsin Supreme Court seat currently held by Justice Louis Butler.

“No seat on the Supreme Court should ever go unopposed especially when that seat is currently held by a liberal political appointee and not an elected official,” said Schutze. “Louis Butler’s judicial philosophy prefers to educate criminals. I prefer to educate our children to prevent them from becoming criminals. We can make our streets safer by actually enforcing the laws and supporting our law enforcement agencies.” Schutze added.

Schutze offers himself as a conservative alternative to the very liberal incumbent. This election can shift the majority on the high court back to common sense and old fashion values.

Charlie Schutze, 56, holds a B.S. in Accounting from Fordham University, MBA in Taxation from Iona with Post Masters work in Estate Taxation and a J.D. from Pace Law School in New York. Charlie is also a CPA with 15 years of corporate and financial experience to supplement his 20 plus years as an attorney. Schutze, a member of the US Supreme Court Bar, has petitioned the U.S. Supreme Court, has twice argued before the Wisconsin Supreme Court and has participated in a multitude of Court of Appeals cases. In 2001, Charlie ran for the District IV Court of Appeals position against appointee Paul Lundsten.

“I am deeply concerned about the unfriendly business environment that has been created in this state by the high court’s careening to the left to protect special interest groups at the expense of common sense,” Schutze stated. “We continue to lose our best and our brightest graduates to companies outside of the state. We handicap our businesses with the burden and cost of over-regulation, provide little or no incentives to our companies and employees, and yet we blame them for the ills of our economy. ”

Schutze feels that people who have grown up on government paychecks simply cannot understand or appreciate the problems that employers face such as health insurance premiums for staff, payroll and payroll taxes, price competition and competition for quality employees, and over-regulation. A strong business environment is needed to lead the economic recovery. As a private practice attorney with highly varied areas of practice, combined with his financial and tax expertise, Schutze offers the depth and diversity of experience that is needed on our High Court.
