ETHICS QUESTIONNAIRE REOPENED FOR LATE SUBMISSIONS

The League of Women Voters of Wisconsin, Common Cause in Wisconsin and the Wisconsin Democracy Campaign received a great response to their Ethics Voter Guide questionnaires. In recent weeks, the groups have also received an overwhelming number of requests to reopen the Guide to late submissions.

Due to popular demand, the Voter Guide is now reopened. All late submissions already received will be posted on each groups' website. Additional responses will be posted as they are received, through November 1st. All additions to the current Voter Guide will be marked as "Late Submission." We will not accept revisions to currently posted responses.

Candidates can access the questions the League of Women Voters of Wisconsin website or by contacting any of the offices listed above. Candidates may respond by email to lwwwisconsin@lwwwi.org or by fax to (608) 256-1761. Responses must be signed by the candidate or otherwise verified that the response has been submitted. Candidates are strongly encouraged to provide full contact information for voters' use.

The League of Women Voters of Wisconsin, Common Cause in Wisconsin and the Wisconsin Democracy Campaign have been pleased by the significant public pressure on candidates to respond to the questionnaire and are excited to offer more complete candidate information for voters.

Surveys were mailed in July to all Senate candidates in the 17 districts up for election or re-election and also to candidates in all 99 State Assembly districts, as well as to all candidates for Governor, Lt. Governor, Attorney General, Secretary of State and Treasurer. Candidates were given two weeks to respond prior to public release of the guide.
