Kenosha County Executive Jim Kreuser declares Kenosha County “Open for Business”

Kreuser: “We’ll take the jobs that Walker doesn’t want”

KENOSHA — Kenosha County Executive Jim Kreuser today offered to accept any federal stimulus money that Milwaukee County Executive Scott Walker turns down.

“If Scott Walker isn't interested in bringing jobs to Southeast Wisconsin, Kenosha County will gladly put that money to work on the road to economic recovery,” Kreuser said. “Kenosha County is open for business.”

Walker last week told the Milwaukee Journal Sentinel that “I'm not asking for any new projects or things to be done here.”

Kreuser pointed out that when Congress passes a stimulus package, the money will be spent one way or another.

“Our share of that money can either be spent here, or it can be directed to put people back to work in other states,” Kreuser said. “I'm going to fight for Kenosha County families and make sure that we get our share of job creation and then some.”

“I want to make clear to the world that most elected leaders in our region are in favor of creating jobs,” Kreuser continued. “We all hope Walker's inexplicable stance doesn't make businesses think twice about adding jobs in our region.”
