

## MPS expense records now available online

### *District takes steps to provide transparency on costs*

July brings the start of a new fiscal year for Milwaukee Public Schools, and heralds the start of an online service that allows visitors to the district's Web site the ability to see how the district spends taxpayer dollars. Look for the service on the MPS Web site under Budget & Finance as an option labeled "MPS Spending", or use the following link: <http://mpsspending.milwaukee.k12.wi.us/>

Any visitor to the site, including citizens, members of the media and district personnel will be able to search the massive database to review purchase invoices sorted in a variety of ways, such as date, vendor name, school or department. Drop-down menus on the search page will assist the user.

The records reflect purchases that have been made, and not expenses that are anticipated. Records will show purchases starting with the new fiscal year which began July 1, 2009, and date back to the 2005 fiscal year.
