Doyle Extremely Vulnerable Walker Announces First Wave of Finance Committee

More than 50 Civic and Business Leaders Among Foundation of Fundraising Group

[Wauwatosa, Wisc...] Fresh off the heels of a poll that shows their candidate in the lead and the incumbent governor ripe for defeat, Scott Walker's campaign committee today announced the first wave of their finance committee.

More than 50 Wisconsin area civic and business leaders have committed to raise enough money to ensure that Scott Walker is the next Governor of Wisconsin.

Fred Luber, Chairman of Super Steel Corp of Milwaukee and George Dalton, Chairman and CEO of NOVO 1 will serve as the Finance Committee Co-Chairs.

"Twenty years ago, I was honored to help elect a young, intelligent Republican by the name of Tommy Thompson," said Luber. "I see a lot of Tommy in Scott Walker, and am happy to help organize support and help him get elected in 2006."

The campaign has had fundraising events around the state, has solicited contributions in the mail and has received a great many contributions online at www.scottwalker.org.

"Scott Walker raised \$1.4 million in just three years for his elections to a local office. With the team we've assembled, we are confident we will raise enough money to take on the tainted special interest money of Jim Doyle," said John Hiller, Campaign Treasurer. "Our base of support is not special interest PAC money. Since January 1st we've received contributions from nearly 2,000 donors across the state."

On Thursday, the campaign reported that polling results put Jim Doyle as the favored choice of only 35% of Wisconsin voters, whereas 49% of the state believes it is time to give a new person a chance at the job. In the Republican Primary to replace Doyle, Walker has a commanding lead over his only known opponent.

Joining Luber as a co-chair of the Finance Committee will be Mike Hunter, CEO of Volm Bag Company in Antigo. Active in Republican circles in Northeastern Wisconsin, Hunter is also the former Chair of the Wisconsin State Fair Park Board. Also serving on the finance committee are Terry Grosenheider of Madison, Wauwatosa small businessperson Lisa Mauer, Dirk Gasterland, CEO of Cooley State Bank and Secretary/Treasurer of the La Crosse Area Chamber of Commerce and more than 50 others.
