MADISON, WI – Americans for Prosperity-Wisconsin today praised Assembly Majority Leader Jim Steineke and the Assembly for passing AB 384, also known as the regulatory “sunset” bill, legislation that would require government rules to be carefully reviewed and readopted every seven years.
