

Dallet campaign: Leaders from Southeast Wisconsin announce support for Judge Rebecca Dallet

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KENOSHA – Dozens of elected leaders from across Southeast Wisconsin today announced their endorsement for Judge Rebecca Dallet in her campaign for Wisconsin Supreme Court.
