Senator Steve Nass (R-Whitewater) issued the following statement reiterating his intent to fight for middle class families in Wisconsin by standing with Governor Scott Walker in cutting UW System tuition by 5%, lowering property taxes by eliminating the state property tax (Forestry Property Tax) and opposing transportation tax increases:

“Governor Walker prioritized the economic plight of middle class families in the 2017-19 biennial budget.
