

Wisconsin Dept. of Public Instruction: Hearing Sept. 5 on revisions to complaint and appeals procedures

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MADISON — The Wisconsin Department of Public Instruction will conduct a hearing in September on proposed revisions to rules related to complaint resolution and appeals procedures.

The Sept. 5 hearing will be held from 3 to 4 p.m. at the DPI's headquarters, GEF 3, Room P41, 125 South Webster Street, Madison. The hearing site is fully accessible to people with disabilities. For those who cannot attend the hearing, written comments sent to the department will be given the same consideration as public testimony.

The proposed rules will update Chapter PI 1 to revise complaint resolution and appeals procedures to conform with state statute. The proposed rules address all types of appeals and complaints that the department is required by law to hear unless another administrative rule or statute provide more specific procedures. In addition, the rule addresses the procedures related to contested case hearings, specifies the requirements for a proper appeal, and specifies who is responsible for paying for a transcript in a contested case hearing.
