Madison, Milwaukee and Stevens Point – Three domestic violence memorial walks will take place at 11:55 a.m. on October 2, 2017 in Madison, Milwaukee and Stevens Point. The memorial walks honor the victims of domestic violence killings that occurred during 2016 in Wisconsin.

The 11th Annual Purple Ribbon Walk in Madison, put on by End Domestic Abuse WI, Domestic Abuse Intervention Services (DAIS), UNIDOS Against Domestic Violence and Zonta Club of Madison, will begin at the State Street Entrance to the Capitol and circle the Capitol Square. *The 2nd Annual Purple Ribbon Walk* in Stevens Point, sponsored by the Portage County Coordinated Community Response Team, will start at the Portage County Courthouse. In Milwaukee, the *Zonta Says No to Violence Against Women Walk* will start at City Hall. A Number of civic leaders are expected to join community members in the walks.
