MILWAUKEE —Twenty-one members of the Wisconsin LGBT Chamber of Commerce received a score of 100 and the distinction of being one of the “Best Places to Work for LGBT Equality” on the 2018 Corporate Equality Index compiled by the Human Rights Campaign (HRC) Foundation. This is an increase from 15 businesses receiving the same score last year.
