Statewide Radio Buy Follows Digital Ads and Targeted Mail Against Other Democrat Candidates for Governor

[Madison, WI] — The Republican Party of Wisconsin launched a statewide [radio ad](#) today targeting Madison bureaucrat Tony Evers over his failure to lead when Wisconsin children and families needed him most. As Superintendent of Schools, Evers failed to act when a teacher was caught spreading pornography at school, allowing him to continue teaching rather than using his authority to revoke his license.
