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## **Bryce Campaign Calls on Ryan, NRCC to Return Wynn Contributions**

RACINE, WI – The Bryce Campaign released a statement calling on National Republican Congressional Committee (NRCC) and Speaker Paul Ryan to return any contributions they've received from Steve Wynn, who stepped down on Saturday as the Republican National Committee's finance chair following accusations that he sexually harassed several of his employees. Bryce is a Democratic congressional candidate challenging Speaker Ryan in Wisconsin's First.

"It's been two days since several women came forward to accuse the Republican's National Finance Chair of systemic workplace sexual harassment and Paul Ryan has said nothing," said Communications Director Lauren Hitt. "He should make clear the reported behavior is unacceptable, and he and the NRCC should return any contributions they've accepted from Wynn."

According to [reports](#), the NRCC has collected at least \$106,000 from Wynn. The NRCC repeatedly [called](#) on Democratic candidates to return contributions from Weinstein, among others.

Randy Bryce is a U.S. Army veteran, cancer survivor, and union ironworker. He was raised in southeastern Wisconsin, and went to public schools. Randy's father was a police officer, and his mother worked in a doctor's office. After graduation, Randy enlisted in the U.S. Army, and was posted to Honduras, where he earned the Army Achievement Medal. After returning stateside, Randy was diagnosed with cancer, which he survived, but only after struggling through the bankruptcy that came with the medical bills. Once in remission, Randy found his way to an apprenticeship as an iron worker, a trade he's now been practicing and fighting to protect from anti-labor laws for nearly 20 years. Randy currently resides in Caledonia, WI with his son, Ben, who attends public schools like his dad.

Randy joined the race for Wisconsin's 1st Congressional District in Summer 2017.
