

Gov. Walker: Signs Bills to Create and Expand Outdoor Recreation, Attract Talent to Wisconsin, and Improve Medical Assistance

- MADISON** - Governor Scott Walker signed bills into law expanding outdoor recreational activities across the state, creating an interagency talent attraction campaign to bring millennials, Wisconsin alumni, and transitioning veterans back to Wisconsin, and a number of bills to help address medical assistance needs in Wisconsin today at the Wisconsin State Capitol. Governor Walker signed a total of 93 bills into law today.
- Assembly Bill 029** - This legislation makes changes to the face-to-face client contact requirements for social worker licensure. Authored by the Joint Committee for Review of Administrative Rules the bill passed the Senate on a voice vote and was concurred by the Assembly on a vote of 96-0. It is Act 356.
- Assembly Bill 030** - This legislation requires the Marriage and Family Therapy, Professional Counseling, and Social Work Examining Board to promulgate rules establishing examination requirements for certification and licensure by the board. Authored by the Joint Committee for Review of Administrative Rules, the bill passed the Assembly on a voice vote and was concurred by the Senate on a voice vote. It is Act 357.
- Senate Bill 052** - This legislation moves the amount of time the Department of Corrections may place certain juveniles participating in the Serious Juvenile Offender Program. Authored by Senator Leah Vuksir (R-Brookfield) and Representative Joe Sanfelippo (R-New Berlin), the bill passed the Senate on a voice vote and was concurred by the Assembly on a voice vote. It is Act 308.
- Senate Bill 055** - This legislation increases the mandatory minimum sentence to five years and for certain crimes if the person has been previously convicted of one of the crimes or a crime punishable by life imprisonment. Authored by Senator Leah Vuksir (R-Brookfield) and Representative Joe Sanfelippo (R-New Berlin), the bill passed the Senate on a voice vote and was concurred by the Assembly on a voice vote. It is Act 309.
- Senate Bill 056** - This legislation requires the court to impose the mandatory minimum three-year incarceration period if the person who is prohibited from possessing a firearm violates the prohibition while on probation, parole, extended supervision, or conditional release for the commission of a prior felony or violent misdemeanor. Authored by Senator Leah Vuksir (R-Brookfield) and Representative Joe Sanfelippo (R-New Berlin), the bill passed the Senate on a vote of 29-4 and was concurred by the Assembly on a voice vote. It is Act 310.
- Senate Bill 058** - This legislation creates a Class E felony for taking a vehicle without the owner's consent for a vote, or threat of force. Authored by Senator Leah Vuksir (R-Brookfield) and Representative Joe Sanfelippo (R-New Berlin), the bill passed the Senate on a vote of 26-7 and was concurred by the Assembly on a voice vote. It is Act 311.
- Assembly Bill 085** - This legislation provides that an individual holding a local public office may be appointed to serve as an election official without having to vacate the local public office. Authored by Senator Janet Bewley (D-Ashland) and Representative Lisa Subeck (D-Madison), the bill passed the Assembly on a voice vote and was concurred by the Senate on a voice vote. It is Act 326.
- Assembly Bill 112** - This legislation clarifies that tribal governments are eligible for treatment alternatives and diversion (TAD) grants administered by the Department of Justice. Introduced by the Joint Legislative Council, the bill passed the Assembly on a voice vote and was concurred by the Senate on a voice vote. It is Act 351.
- Assembly Bill 114** - This legislation adds tribal judges, tribal prosecutors and tribal law enforcement officers to the laws that criminalize bribery of judges, prosecutors and law enforcement officers and their family members. Introduced by the Joint Legislative Council, the bill passed the Assembly on a voice vote and was concurred by the Senate on a voice vote. It is Act 352.
- Assembly Bill 120** - This legislation makes changes to the publication of legal notices. Introduced by the Joint Legislative Council, the bill passed the Assembly on a voice vote and was concurred by the Senate on a voice vote. It is Act 353.
- Assembly Bill 332** - This legislation permits the annual meeting of a common or union high school district or the school board of a school district to adopt a resolution to reduce the number of signatures required on nomination papers submitted by candidates for school district officer. Authored by Senator Dan Feyen (R-Fond du Lac) and Representative Jerry Thielfield (R-Fond du Lac), the bill passed the Assembly on a voice vote and was concurred by the Senate on a voice vote. It is Act 322.
- Assembly Bill 342** - This legislation increases the penalty by one felony classification level of the vehicle that is taken or driven without consent is a commercial motor vehicle and makes it a Class F felony to steal property with a value that exceeds \$100,000. Authored by Senator Jerry Petrowski (R-Marathon) and Representative John Spiros (R-Marshfield), the bill passed the Assembly on a voice vote and was concurred by the Senate on a voice vote. It is Act 287.
- Assembly Bill 355** - This legislation expands the definition and penalty structure of the crime of neglect of a child and creates the crime of repeated acts of neglect of the same child. Authored by Senator Rob Cowles (R-Green Bay) and Representative Cody Horlacher (R-Mukwonago), the bill passed the Assembly on a voice vote and was concurred by the Senate on a voice vote. It is Act 283.
- Assembly Bill 356** - This legislation changes the renewal period from a two year to a three-year process for EMS responders. Authored by former Senator Sheila Harsdorf (R-River Falls) and Representative Jesse Kremer (R-Kewaskum), the bill passed the Assembly on a voice vote and was concurred by the Senate on a voice vote.
- Senate Bill 381** - This legislation requires the Department of Health Services to establish rules and policies for access to complex rehabilitation technology for complex needs patients who are recipients of Medical Assistance. Authored by Senator Rob Cowles (R-Green Bay) and Representative David Steffen (R-Green Bay), the bill passed the Senate on a voice vote and was concurred by the Assembly on a voice vote. It is Act 306.
- Assembly Bill 469** - This legislation changes the law on the leasing of space in self-storage facilities and units, and disposal of personal property by non-paysments. Authored by Senator Janis Ringhand (D-Evanston) and Representative Peter Barca (D-Kenosha), the bill passed the Assembly on a voice vote and was concurred by the Senate on a voice vote. It is Act 305.
- Assembly Bill 477** - This legislation requires the Department of Transportation to remain administrative provisions regarding supplemental aid for school districts with a large area into the statutes. Authored by Senator Tom Tiffany (R-Hazelhurst) and Representative Jeffrey Mursau (R-Crivitz), the bill passed the Assembly on a voice vote and was concurred by the Senate on a voice vote. It is Act 300.
- Senate Bill 483** - This legislation requires the Governor, during a state of emergency declared by the Governor, to waive any fee required by the state for the replacement of a permit, license, approval or other authorization for a person who resides or is headquartered in the area covered by the state of emergency. Authored by Senator Jerry Petrowski (R-Marathon) and Representative Romaine Quinn (R-Barron), the bill passed the Assembly on a voice vote and was concurred by the Senate on a voice vote. It is Act 291.
- Assembly Bill 489** - This legislation repeals the requirement that the Department of Health Services require that a person who is a resident of a long-term care facility be a resident of the facility for a certain period of time before being eligible for a license. Authored by Senator Dan Feyen (R-Fond du Lac) and Representative Tyler Vorpapel (R-Plymouth), the bill passed the Assembly on a voice vote and was concurred by the Senate on a voice vote. It is Act 303.
- Assembly Bill 518** - This legislation limits the amount a condominium association may charge for providing a payroll statement or required disclosure materials, requires the disclosure of certain information in connection with a transfer of a condominium unit, and creates a procedure for a unit owner to acquire a payroll statement from an association that has failed to provide one. Authored by Senator Devin Lekshus (R-Doubsburg) and Representative Ron Tusler (R-Harrison), the bill passed the Assembly on a voice vote and was concurred by the Senate on a voice vote. It is Act 275.
- Assembly Bill 521** - This legislation modifies the membership requirements for incorporation of a Red Arrow Club. Authored by Senator Pat Testin (R-Stevens Point) and Representative Ken Skowronski (R-Franklin), the bill passed the Assembly on a voice vote and was concurred by the Senate on a voice vote. It is Act 302.
- Assembly Bill 522** - This legislation changes venue requirements for filing a temporary restraining order. Authored by former Senator Sheila Harsdorf (R-River Falls) and Representative Ron Tusler (R-Harrison), the bill passed the Assembly on a voice vote and was concurred by the Senate on a voice vote. It is Act 302.
- Assembly Bill 583** - This legislation allows a sales and use tax exemption to an electric cooperative, or by a telecommunications utility to another telecommunications utility, for work performed for disaster relief. Authored by Senator Jerry Petrowski (R-Marathon) and Representative Romaine Quinn (R-Barron), the bill passed the Assembly on a voice vote and was concurred by the Senate on a voice vote of 32-0. It is Act 290.
- Assembly Bill 584** - This legislation allows a person to be appointed as a guardian of the estate for a person who is unable to manage their own affairs. Authored by Senator Jerry Petrowski (R-Marathon) and Representative Romaine Quinn (R-Barron), the bill passed the Assembly on a voice vote and was concurred by the Senate on a voice vote. It is Act 291.
- Assembly Bill 589** - This legislation specifically lists the actions that are legally allowed under customary maintenance without jeopardizing the non-conforming status of an outdoor advertising sign. Authored by Senator Dan Feyen (R-Fond du Lac) and Representative Tyler Vorpapel (R-Plymouth), the bill passed the Assembly on a voice vote and was concurred by the Senate on a voice vote of 32-0. It is Act 292.
- Assembly Bill 600** - This legislation allows the Town of Cable in Bayfield County to create a tax incremental district (TID) in the same manner as a city or village. Authored by Senator Jerry Petrowski (R-Marathon) and Representative Romaine Quinn (R-Barron), the bill passed the Assembly on a voice vote and was concurred by the Senate on a voice of 32-0. It is Act 292.
- Assembly Bill 601** - This legislation changes the statutory maximum allowable length of a contract for Global Positioning System (GPS) electronic monitoring equipment used to track certain offenders from 3 years to 7 years. Authored by Senator Van Wangoard (R-Racine) and Representative Ed Brooks (R-Reedsburg), the bill passed the Assembly on a voice vote and was concurred by the Senate on a voice vote. It is Act 346.
- Assembly Bill 605** - This legislation requires the Department of Transportation to conduct a study on the feasibility of a toll on the Wisconsin Turnpike. Authored by Senator Terry Mullton (R-Chippewa Falls) and Representative Romaine Quinn (R-Barron), the bill passed the Assembly on a voice vote and was concurred by the Senate on a voice vote. It is Act 343.
- Assembly Bill 607** - This legislation allows a person to designate a TOD beneficiary in any document, not solely in a will. Authored by former Senator Frank Lase (R-De Pere) and Representative Joan Ballweg (R-Markesan), the bill passed the Assembly on a voice vote and was concurred by the Senate on a voice vote. It is Act 332.
- Assembly Bill 608** - This legislation requires the Department of Transportation to conduct a study on the feasibility of a toll on the Wisconsin Turnpike. Authored by Senator Terry Mullton (R-Chippewa Falls) and Representative Romaine Quinn (R-Barron), the bill passed the Assembly on a voice vote and was concurred by the Senate on a voice vote. It is Act 293.
- Assembly Bill 610** - This legislation requires the Department of Transportation to conduct a study on the feasibility of a toll on the Wisconsin Turnpike. Authored by Senator Terry Mullton (R-Chippewa Falls) and Representative Romaine Quinn (R-Barron), the bill passed the Assembly on a voice vote and was concurred by the Senate on a voice vote. It is Act 334.
- Assembly Bill 616** - This legislation requires the Department of Transportation to conduct a study on the feasibility of a toll on the Wisconsin Turnpike. Authored by Senator Terry Mullton (R-Chippewa Falls) and Representative Romaine Quinn (R-Barron), the bill passed the Assembly on a voice vote and was concurred by the Senate on a voice vote. It is Act 335.
- Assembly Bill 626** - This legislation authorizes the Department of Natural Resources to establish a fall open season for hunting deer within the Apostle Islands National Lakeshore that begins before the Saturdays immediately preceding the fourth Thursday in November if the season is open for hunting deer only with muzzle-loading firearms. Authored by Senator Tom Tiffany (R-Hazelhurst) and Representative Beth Myers (D-Bayfield), the bill passed the Assembly on a voice vote and was concurred by the Senate on a voice vote. It is Act 298.
- Assembly Bill 627** - This legislation gives DHS greater flexibility in the use of funds for the direct reimbursement pilot program. Authored by Senator Terry Mullton (R-Chippewa Falls) and Representative Kathy Berner (R-Lake Hallie), the bill passed the Assembly on a voice vote and was concurred by the Senate on a voice vote. It is Act 344.
- Assembly Bill 650** - This legislation removes the requirement that the Department of Justice's crime victim restitution report include the recipient's identity and amount paid to him or her. Authored by Senator Luther Olsen (R-Ripon) and Representative Todd Novak (R-Dodgeville), the bill passed the Assembly on a voice vote and was concurred by the Senate on a voice vote. It is Act 345.
- Assembly Bill 654** - This legislation requires that a Public Service Answering Point (PSAP) either have dispatchers trained to give telephone CPR instructions, or to transfer the call to another PSAP that has the trained dispatchers who can. Authored by Senator Jerry Petrowski (R-Marathon) and Representative Treig Proschinske (R-Mondovi), the bill passed the Assembly on a voice of 95-0 and was concurred by the Senate on a voice of 32-0. It is Act 296.
- Assembly Bill 655** - This legislation requires the Department of Transportation to conduct a study on the feasibility of a toll on the Wisconsin Turnpike. Authored by former Senator Sheila Harsdorf (R-River Falls) and Representative Kathy Berner (R-Lake Hallie), the bill passed the Assembly on a voice vote and was concurred by the Senate on a voice vote. It is Act 345.
- Assembly Bill 668** - This legislation requires bicycles operating on state trails to have a headlight and taillight that are visible from a distance of 500 feet. Authored by Senator Tom Tiffany (R-Hazelhurst) and Representative Ron Tusler (R-Harrison), the bill passed the Assembly on a voice vote and was concurred by the Senate on a voice vote. It is Act 301.
- Senate Bill 669** - This legislation raises the limit on the amount of tax credits that may be certified by the Wisconsin Economic Development Corporation under the historic rehabilitation tax credit from \$500,000 to \$3,500,000. Authored by Senator Alberta Darling (R-River Hills) and Representative Mike Rohrkaste (R-Neenah), the bill passed the Senate on a voice vote of 29-4. It is Act 339.
- Assembly Bill 678** - This legislation makes it illegal for a driver to fail to stop a vehicle for a federal law enforcement officer or an unmarked police vehicle that the individual knows or reasonably should know is being operated by a law enforcement officer. Authored by Senator Van Wangoard (R-Racine) and Representative Joel Kleefisch (R-Dodgeville), the bill passed the Assembly on a voice vote and was concurred by the Senate on a voice vote. It is Act 342.
- Assembly Bill 691** - This legislation provides minimum requirements for third-party bidders as it relates to participation at mortgage foreclosure sales. Authored by Senator Luther Olsen (R-Ripon) and Representative Terry Katma (R-Oostburg), the bill passed the Assembly on a voice vote and was concurred by the Senate on a voice vote. It is Act 339.
- Senate Bill 695** - This legislation makes changes to vehicle following distances for large trucks to allow for large trucks to use a new technology called platooning, where the trucks will be closer together than current following distances permit. Authored by Senator Jerry Petrowski (R-Marathon) and Representative Mike Rohrkaste (R-Neenah), the bill passed the Senate on a voice vote and was concurred by the Assembly on a voice vote. It is Act 294.
- Assembly Bill 699** - This legislation requires the Department of Transportation to designate and mark the bridge on USH 41 across the Oconto River in the city of Oconto as the "PFC Valentine T. Warrichalet Memorial Bridge." Authored by Senator Dave Hansen (D-Green Bay) and Representative John Nygren (R-Marinette), the bill passed the Assembly on a voice vote and was concurred by the Senate on a voice vote. It is Act 276.
- Assembly Bill 731** - This legislation makes changes to qualification of newspapers to receive compensation for publication of legal notice. Authored by Senator Rob Cowles (R-Green Bay) and Representative Joel Kleefisch (R-Sturgeon Bay), the bill passed the Assembly on a voice vote and was concurred by the Senate on a voice vote. It is Act 292.
- Assembly Bill 732** - This legislation provides funding for the Veterans Outreach and Recovery Program which provides Veterans with crisis mental health services and case management. Authored by Senator Jerry Petrowski (R-Marathon) and Representative May Felkowski (R-Irma), the bill passed the Assembly on a vote of 95-0 and was concurred by the Senate on a voice vote. It is Act 319.
- Assembly Bill 733** - This legislation requires the fee required for initial occupational credentials for veterans and individuals whose family income level is below 180% of the federal poverty line. Authored by Senator Dan Feyen (R-Fond du Lac) and Representative Todd Novak (R-Dodgeville), the bill passed the Assembly on a voice vote and was concurred by the Senate on a voice of 32-0. It is Act 319.
- Assembly Bill 740** - This legislation allows an applicant to sue for at least 375 on Part III of the examination administered by the National Board of Chiropractic Examiners to a score of at least 375 on Part IV of that examination in order to be granted a chiropractor license. Authored by Senator Chris Kapenga (R-Delafield) and Representative Rob Hutton (R-Brookfield), the bill passed the Assembly on a voice of 56-34 and was concurred by the Senate on a voice of 18-14. It is Act 327.
- Assembly Bill 752** - This legislation simplifies the application process for alcohol beverage, cigarette, and tobacco licenses and permits. Authored by Senator Jerry Petrowski (R-Marathon) and Representative Joan Ballweg (R-Markesan), the bill passed the Assembly on a voice vote and was concurred by the Senate on a voice vote. It is Act 285.
- Assembly Bill 754** - This legislation eliminates a special vehicle weight provision, for the oversize overweight transportation of certain forest products. Authored by Senator Tom Tiffany (R-Hazelhurst) and Representative Rob Swearingen (R-Rhineland), the bill passed the Assembly on a voice vote and was concurred by the Senate on a voice vote. It is Act 289.
- Assembly Bill 766** - This legislation generally exempts out-of-state licensed physicians practicing at sporting events or facilities in Wisconsin from being required to be licensed in this state. Authored by Senator Howard Marklein (R-Spring Green) and Representative Adam Neylon (R-Pewaukee), the bill passed the Assembly on a voice vote and was concurred by the Senate on a voice vote. It is Act 341.
- Assembly Bill 768** - This legislation requires the Department of Transportation to conduct a study on the feasibility of a toll on the Wisconsin Turnpike. Authored by former Senator Frank Lase (R-De Pere) and Representative Dale Kooyenga (R-Brookfield), the bill passed the Assembly on a voice vote and was concurred by the Senate on a voice vote. It is Act 338.
- Assembly Bill 771** - This legislation provides that if a political subdivision has in effect an ordinance that authorizes the installation of a rental property or rental unit upon a complaint from an inspector or other employee or elected official of the political subdivision, the political subdivision must maintain a record of certain information related to inspections performed upon a complaint from an employee or official. Authored by Senator Frank Lase (R-De Pere) and Representative Rob Brooks (R-Saukville), the bill passed the Assembly on a voice of 56-34 and was concurred by the Senate on a voice of 18-14. It is Act 317.
- Assembly Bill 774** - This legislation requires the Department of Transportation to conduct a study on the feasibility of a toll on the Wisconsin Turnpike. Authored by former Senator Frank Lase (R-De Pere) and Representative Dale Kooyenga (R-Brookfield), the bill passed the Assembly on a voice vote and was concurred by the Senate on a voice of 18-14. It is Act 312.
- Assembly Bill 789** - This legislation exempts synthesis and gasification facilities from being regulated as solid waste facilities. Authored by Senator Rob Cowles (R-Green Bay) and Representative Paul Tittl (R-Manitowoc), the bill passed the Assembly on a voice vote and was concurred by the Senate on a voice vote. It is Act 284.
- Assembly Bill 804** - This legislation determines what is to be done with the earnings generated on trust fund holdings, which go to the UW - System, and permits the Board of Commissioners of Public Lands to sell lands between the board's trust funds for the appraised value of the land. Authored by Senator Steve Nass (R-Whitewater) and Representative Tyler August (R-Lake Geneva), the bill passed the Assembly on a vote of 65-32 and was concurred by the Senate on a vote of 22-10. It is Act 334.
- Assembly Bill 805** - This legislation requires the Department of Transportation to conduct a study on the feasibility of a toll on the Wisconsin Turnpike. Authored by Senator Leah Vuksir (R-Brookfield) and Representative Dale Kooyenga (R-Brookfield), the bill passed the Assembly on a voice vote and was concurred by the Senate on a voice vote. It is Act 307.
- Assembly Bill 809** - This legislation makes changes to notes, bonds, and economic development programs of the Wisconsin Housing and Economic Development Authority, homeownership mortgage loans used to refinance existing mortgages, and uses of the housing rehabilitation loan fund. Authored by Senator Alberta Darling (R-River Hills) and Representative Beth Myers (D-Bayfield), the bill passed the Assembly on a voice vote and was concurred by the Senate on a voice vote. It is Act 277.
- Assembly Bill 811** - This legislation directs the Wisconsin Economic Development Corporation to collaborate with state agencies to develop and implement initiatives for the attraction of talent to and retention of talent in Wisconsin, including by leveraging the existing programs of state agencies for those purposes. Authored by Senator Dan Feyen (R-Fond du Lac) and Representative Beth Myers (D-Bayfield), the bill passed the Assembly on a voice vote and was concurred by the Senate on a voice vote. It is Act 338.
- Assembly Bill 812** - This legislation updates existing real estate disclosure reports. Authored by Senator Luther Olsen (R-Ripon) and Representative Cody Horlacher (R-Mukwonago), the bill passed the Assembly on a voice vote and was concurred by the Senate on a voice vote. It is Act 338.
- Assembly Bill 818** - This legislation requires the Department of Health Services to promulgate rules regarding approval of nonmedical declaration amendments and certification of boundary changes. Authored by Senator Luther Olsen (R-Ripon) and Representative Joan Ballweg (R-Markesan), the bill passed the Assembly on a voice vote and was concurred by the Senate on a voice of 32-0. It is Act 333.
- Assembly Bill 819** - This legislation requires the Board for Professional Development (BPD) to develop an employment coaching program. Authored by Senator Dan Feyen (R-Fond du Lac) and Representative John Macco (R-Ledgeville), the bill passed the Assembly on a vote of 95-0 and was concurred by the Senate on a voice vote. It is Act 343.
- Assembly Bill 822** - This legislation makes several changes relating to financial institutions and the Department of Financial Institutions. Authored by Senator Howard Marklein (R-Spring Green) and Representative Terry Katma (R-Oostburg), the bill passed the Assembly on a voice vote and was concurred by the Senate on a voice vote. It is Act 340.
- Assembly Bill 825** - This legislation as amended, makes various changes to Wisconsin's fair employment law with respect to the ability of state and local licensing agencies to deny a license based on an individual's arrest or conviction record. Authored by Senator Alberta Darling (R-River Hills) and Representative Warren Petyrk (R-Eleva), the bill passed the Assembly on a voice vote and was concurred by the Senate on a voice vote. It is Act 278.
- Assembly Bill 834** - This legislation allows an applicant to score at least 375 on Part III of the examination administered by the National Board of Chiropractic Examiners and to score at least 375 on Part IV of that examination in order to be granted a chiropractor license. Authored by Senator Jerry Petrowski (R-Marathon) and Representative Dale Kooyenga (R-Brookfield), the bill passed the Assembly on a voice vote and was concurred by the Senate on a voice vote. It is Act 288.
- Assembly Bill 837** - This legislation makes changes to fulfill director apprenticeship standards including education requirements, number of apprentices, length of apprenticeship, and supervision requirements. Authored by Senator Roger Roth (R-Appleton) and Representative Nancy VanderMeer (R-Tomah), the bill passed the Assembly on a voice vote and was concurred by the Senate on a voice vote. It is Act 338.
- Assembly Bill 839** - This legislation updates state law to reflect Wisconsin court case decisions regarding property tax assessments. Authored by the Law Revision Committee, the bill passed the Assembly on a voice vote and was concurred by the Senate on a voice vote. It is Act 358.
- Assembly Bill 839** - This legislation specifies that a determination of indigence is not required before the state public defender may appoint an attorney to represent a child and amend the statutes that describe the procedure for collecting attorney fees for defendants who have been determined to be indigent. Authored by the Law Revision Committee, the bill passed the Assembly on a voice vote and was concurred by the Senate on a voice vote. It is Act 359.
- Assembly Bill 840** - This legislation clarifies that the Legislative Technology Services Bureau is to reconcile and compile municipal boundary information for purposes of a statewide database twice a year instead of once every ten years and makes technical updates to the statutes. Authored by the Law Revision Committee, the bill passed the Assembly on a voice vote and was concurred by the Senate on a voice vote. It is Act 360.
- Assembly Bill 841** - This legislation makes certain changes, recommended by DOA, to bond and raffie law. Authored by the Law Revision Committee, the bill passed the Assembly on a voice vote and was concurred by the Senate on a voice vote. It is Act 361.
- Assembly Bill 842** - This legislation clarifies employment requirements for participation in the Wisconsin Retirement System and modifies certain effective dates. Authored by the Law Revision Committee, the bill passed the Assembly on a voice vote and was concurred by the Senate on a voice vote. It is Act 362.
- Assembly Bill 844** - This legislation eliminates unnecessary reporting requirements regarding federal highway money and makes technical changes to other statutory references. Authored by the Law Revision Committee, the bill passed the Assembly on a voice vote and was concurred by the Senate on a voice vote. It is Act 363.
- Assembly Bill 845** - This legislation is a technical correction bill that removes obsolete or redundant language; corrects cross references and other language; addresses treatment of act sections of enacted bills that impact the same statutory sections; and corrects terminology and style inconsistencies. Authored by the Law Revision Committee, the bill passed the Assembly on a voice vote and was concurred by the Senate on a voice vote. It is Act 364.
- Assembly Bill 846** - This legislation is a technical correction bill that removes obsolete cross references due to verbs or repeats; corrects cross references; inserts missing words or creates consistent language. Authored by the Law Revision Committee, the bill passed the Assembly on a voice vote and was concurred by the Senate on a voice vote. It is Act 365.
- Assembly Bill 847** - This legislation makes technical updates to the statutes. Authored by the Law Revision Committee, the bill passed the Assembly on a voice vote and was concurred by the Senate on a voice vote. It is Act 366.
- Assembly Bill 855** - This legislation makes changes to drone regulations by local governments. Authored by Senator Dan Feyen (R-Fond du Lac) and Representative Michael Schra (R-Oshkosh), the bill passed the Assembly on a voice vote and was concurred by the Senate on a voice vote. It is Act 322.
- Assembly Bill 871** - This legislation as amended, requires DHS to create a program to reimburse hospitals and health care systems for intensive care coordination services provided to Medical Assistance recipients that are high utilizers of emergency room services. Authored by Senator Alberta Darling (R-River Hills) and Representative Jesse Rodriguez (R-Oak Creek), the bill passed the Assembly on a vote of 95-0 and was concurred by the Senate on a voice vote. It is Act 279.
- Assembly Bill 872** - This legislation requires the Department of Transportation to conduct a study on the feasibility of a toll on the Wisconsin Turnpike. Authored by former Senator Frank Lase (R-De Pere) and Representative Dale Kooyenga (R-Brookfield), the bill passed the Assembly on a voice vote and was concurred by the Senate on a voice of 97-0 and was concurred by the Senate on a voice of 32-0. It is Act 336.
- Assembly Bill 876** - This legislation makes changes to early refill for prescription eye drops. Authored by Senator Roger Roth (R-Appleton) and Representative John Jagler (R-Watertown), the bill passed the Assembly on a voice vote and was concurred by the Senate on a voice vote. It is Act 305.
- Assembly Bill 877** - This legislation makes changes to the rules of evidence and the rules of procedure in civil actions. Authored by Senator Jerry Petrowski (R-Marathon) and Representative John Jagler (R-Watertown), the bill passed the Assembly on a voice vote and was concurred by the Senate on a voice vote. It is Act 330.
- Assembly Bill 879** - This legislation requires the Department of Transportation to conduct a study on the feasibility of a toll on the Wisconsin Turnpike. Authored by former Senator Frank Lase (R-De Pere) and Representative Dale Kooyenga (R-Brookfield), the bill passed the Assembly on a voice vote and was concurred by the Senate on a voice vote. It is Act 330.
- Assembly Bill 882** - This legislation requires the Department of Transportation to conduct a study on the feasibility of a toll on the Wisconsin Turnpike. Authored by former Senator Frank Lase (R-De Pere) and Representative Dale Kooyenga (R-Brookfield), the bill passed the Assembly on a voice vote and was concurred by the Senate on a voice vote. It is Act 330.
- Assembly Bill 896** - This legislation makes changes to vital records to accommodate and reflect the use of electronic records and the electronic system. Authored by Senator Luther Olsen (R-Ripon) and Representative Joan Ballweg (R-Markesan), the bill passed the Assembly on a voice vote and was concurred by the Senate on a voice vote. It is Act 334.
- Assembly Bill 902** - This legislation modifies certain laws relating to the professional discipline of credential holders. Authored by Senator Chris Kapenga (R-Delafield) and Representative Joan Ballweg (R-Markesan), the bill passed the Assembly on a voice vote and was concurred by the Senate on a voice vote. It is Act 328.
- Assembly Bill 903** - This legislation modifies certain laws relating to the professional discipline of credential holders. Authored by Senator Chris Kapenga (R-Delafield) and Representative Joan Ballweg (R-Markesan), the bill passed the Assembly on a voice vote and was concurred by the Senate on a voice vote. It is Act 329.
- Assembly Bill 904** - This legislation makes changes to the following items regulated by DPS: Commercial building code administration; county authority regarding certain buildings and safety requirements; carbon monoxide detection in commercial residential buildings; examination requirements for marriage and family therapy, professional counseling, and social work credentials; and social worker training. Authored by Senator Chris Kapenga (R-Delafield) and Representative Joan Ballweg (R-Markesan), the bill passed the Assembly on a voice vote and was concurred by the Senate on a voice vote. It is Act 330.
- Assembly Bill 905** - This legislation will simplify and update existing regulations, including the removal of obsolete or redundant statutory language and adding language to provide clarity. Authored by Senator Chris Kapenga (R-Delafield) and Representative Joan Ballweg (R-Markesan), the bill passed the Assembly on a voice vote and was concurred by the Senate on a voice of 32-0. It is Act 340.
- Assembly Bill 911** - This legislation ensures the Commission can continue improving the Fox River by providing a permanent \$100,000 appropriation. Authored by Senator Van Wangoard (R-Racine) and Representative Chuck Wichters (R-Muskogee), the bill passed the Assembly on a voice of 97-0 and was concurred by the Senate on a voice of 32-0. It is Act 340.
- Assembly Bill 913** - This legislation would make it illegal to take a catfish by bow and arrow. Authored by Senator Tom Tiffany (R-Hazelhurst) and Representative Treig Proschinske (R-Mondovi), the bill passed the Assembly on a voice vote and was concurred by the Senate on a voice vote. It is Act 297.
- Assembly Bill 917** - This legislation creates a certification program for manufacturers to certify as being telecommuter friendly. Authored by Senator Howard Marklein (R-Spring Green) and Representative Romaine Quinn (R-Barron), the bill passed the Assembly on a voice vote and was concurred by the Senate on a voice vote. It is Act 342.
- Assembly Bill 926** - This legislation would exempt routine matters of shoreline maintenance from requiring a permit on the shorelines of certain bodies of water. Authored by Senator Rob Cowles (R-Green Bay) and Representative John Nygren (R-Marinette), the bill passed the Assembly on a voice of 59-35 and was concurred by the Senate on a voice vote. It is Act 281.
- Assembly Bill 941** - This legislation allows a person to be appointed as a guardian of the estate for a person who is unable to manage their own affairs. Authored by Senator Leah Vuksir (R-Brookfield) and Representative Paul Tittl (R-Manitowoc), the bill passed the Assembly on a voice vote and was concurred by the Senate on a voice vote. It is Act 285.
- Assembly Bill 943** - This legislation makes numerous changes to laws administered by the Department of Military Affairs. Authored by Senator Pat Testin (R-Stevens Point) and Representative Ken Skowronski (R-Franklin), the bill passed the Assembly on a voice of 93-0 and was concurred by the Senate on a voice of 32-0. It is Act 274.
- Assembly Bill 952** - This legislation extends TID's one and four in the Village of Caledonia to the year 2039. Authored by Senator Van Wangoard (R-Racine) and Representative Thomas Westbroten (R-Caledonia), the bill passed the Assembly on a voice vote and was concurred by the Senate on a voice of 32-0. It is Act 349.
