Today, Democratic Gubernatorial candidate Mahlon Mitchell released the following statement on Governor Walker's planned visit to the White House on Monday to discuss infrastructure with President Trump:

"Governor Walker has had eight years to tackle Wisconsin's infrastructure crisis, and he has failed. First, he turned down \$810 million in federal funding—and hundreds of jobs—to build high speed rail connecting Madison and Milwaukee.
