MADISON, Wis. — One Wisconsin Now Executive Director Scot Ross released the following statements about a federal court ruling that says Donald Trump cannot block twitter users based on their political views. One Wisconsin Now filed a lawsuit in November 2017 against Wisconsin Republican Assembly Speaker Robin Vos and Republican Reps.
