CEDARBURG – Chris Rahlf, candidate for the Wisconsin State Assembly District 60, today issued the following statement:

“I’m proud to have the endorsement of the Wisconsin chapter of the Sierra Club. The chapter was named after John Muir, who founded the organization in the late 1800’s. He was known for his conservation efforts and was quoted as saying, “Oh that glorious Wisconsin wilderness.” We have lost sight of this concept here in Wisconsin over the past eight years and some politicians are pushing a false narrative that we can only spur business growth by rolling back environmental protections.

Rich and Chris live in Cedarburg with their two rescue dogs, Chief and Carson, and cat, Mugs.
