

Ramthun campaign: Timothy Ramthun announces candidacy for 59th Assembly District

Campbellsport, Wis. – Village of Kewaskum native Timothy Ramthun, N641 Ramthun Lane in the Township of Auburn, Fond Du Lac County, announced today the filing of candidacy papers to officially enter the contest for the people's 59th District seat in the Wisconsin State Assembly. Currently serving his second term on Kewaskum's Board of Education, Ramthun seeks to occupy the seat currently held by Representative Jesse Kremer.
