Madison: Mary Floyd, owner of Country Styler in St. Nazianz, received a Trailblazer Pioneer Award at the 2018 Governor's Trailblazer Awards for Women in Business ceremony at the Wisconsin State Capitol today. Governor Walker presented the awards to 17 recipients in Madison.
