6th District Congressional Democratic candidate Dan Kohl recently argued for term limits, saying eight years in Congress is enough. Apparently lost on Kohl is the irony of his position, given that his uncle, retired Senator Herb Kohl, served 24 years in the U.S. Senate.

On "Upfront with Mike Gousha" Kohl told Gousha he believes in instituting term limits. He commented, "There are too many career politicians in Washington Mike, who put their party's interest ahead of what needs to be done for their constituents. I think instituting term limits would be a step in the right direction to eliminate a lot of the dysfunction and make Washington work better." When asked how long he would pledge to serve if elected, Kohl responded, "I think eight years is enough time to go to Washington make a difference for people and then come home." While Kohl
