Mother of six and first-time candidate first ever woman to run for Wisconsin 5th District seat

WASHINGTON - With the August 14 Wisconsin primaries just weeks away, Republican Women for Progress (RWFP) has named long-time Waukesha County pediatrician Dr. Jennifer Hoppe Vipond to its 2018 Women to Watch list.

Vipond, a mother of six and first-time candidate for office, is the first ever woman to run for Wisconsin's 5th District seat in the U.S. House of Representatives. Having served residents of the 5th district for 25 years as a pediatrician, Dr. Vipond plans to leverage her medical experience to address the critical issues of healthcare policy, ending the opioid epidemic, and reducing gun violence.
