Company purchasing downtown building and expecting to create at least 200 high-tech jobs

[Madison, Wis.] – Following the historic Foxconn groundbreaking – the largest economic development project in Wisconsin’s history – the company announced Friday that they are expanding into Green Bay by purchasing a six-story building and creating at least 200 high-tech jobs.

Wisconsin’s comeback was on full display last week as Foxconn broke ground on their new investment in Wisconsin’s workers.
