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Grant Program Focuses on Advancing Health Equity

The Wisconsin Partnership Program is currently seeking applicants for the 2018 [Community Impact Grants program](#). The overarching goal of the Community Impact Grants program is to advance health equity in Wisconsin communities through support for large-scale, evidence-informed, community-academic partnership initiatives that address the social determinants of health. These partnerships require substantial and authentic community involvement to achieve sustained policy, systems and environmental change, and must be supported by robust evaluation. Each award is for a maximum of \$1 million over a period of up to five years. Visit med.wisc.edu/partnership for details.
