**Madison, Wis.** – Starting Oct. 15, all five candidates running for Wisconsin Lt. Governor will appear on “The Morning Show” with John Munson. Each weekday at 7 a.m. through Oct. 19, candidates will discuss issues that matter to people across the state. According to Kealey Bultena, Executive Producer of “The Morning Show,” WPR is giving listeners an opportunity they don’t get anywhere else. “The five candidates offer a range of perspectives, and they have different backgrounds and experiences,” she says. “Each candidate joins us at the same time during the week, so people in the audience can listen and decide who deserves their vote. Oct. 19: Wil Losch – Independent
