MADISON — As students in Wisconsin and across the country [participate in walkouts and marches](#) to assert their right to feel and be safe from gun violence both in and out of school, [Wisconsin's Republican U.S. Senate candidates are calling for adding guns in classrooms](#), rather than heading the students' calls for commonsense gun safety reforms.

Just last month, Leah Vukmir and Kevin Nicholson each [endorsed](#) arming teachers and putting guns inside classrooms — [a position opposed by 56% of Americans](#).

Vukmir, for her part, doesn't believe that guns are a leading factor in school shootings, at all. Instead, [Vukmir insists](#), the *real* problem is "[school programs aimed at coddling teens](#)" and what she calls the "self-esteem movement."
