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Establishes pattern of at least seven instances of plagiarism over six years, debunking Evers' claims that plagiarism only occurred in one budget

[Madison, WI] — Today, the Republican Party of Wisconsin revealed more instances of plagiarism from Tony Evers' previous budget proposals, establishing a pattern of plagiarism that includes seven instances over the course of six years. On Friday, Evers tried to dismiss initial allegations [on the debate stage](#) saying that his plagiarism only involved the back pages of "**a** budget," and his [spokesman](#) referred to it as "**this** case," both of which are contradicted by these latest revelations. Today's newly uncovered examples include a section on high school dropouts that was copied verbatim in Evers' 2013-15 budget proposal, and another plagiarized section on workforce that appeared not only in his 2019-21 budget, but also has been included in each of Evers' budget proposals since 2015, in different ways – undercutting any possible explanation of a simple oversight error.

"Tony Evers repeatedly plagiarized the education budgets he authored over the course of six years — failing to meet a level of accountability a teacher would require from any 3rd grader," said Alec Zimmerman, spokesman for the Republican Party of Wisconsin. "When you're cheating on your schoolwork in Tony's position, it's called failed leadership."
