The Wisconsin Paper Council Honors State Representative Katrina Shankland With Its "Legislator of the Year" Award

The 51-year-old trade association presented Rep. Shankland with their Legislator of the Year Award at their 69th Annual Meeting held at Lambeau Field on June 20, 2019. Each year the WPC selects two Legislators, one from each house and each political party to receive these prestigious awards.
