

Sen. Feyen: Step Therapy bill passes the Senate with bipartisan support

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MADISON- Today, Senate Bill 26 passed the Senate with unanimous, bipartisan support. This bill aims to improve prescription drug access and create more transparency and flexibility in the process of step therapy. When a patient is prescribed a certain drug treatment, their health insurance plan may require them to try a less expensive treatment before the originally prescribed drug. This process is known as step therapy. Senate Bill 26 requires step therapy protocol to take into account a patient's medical history and how their medical condition might interfere with the drug's effect. Senate Bill 26 empowers the consumer with the ability to impact their own healthcare choices and care.
