

Village of Denmark: Announces new business development corridor

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Corridor to Create Hundreds of New Jobs, Millions in Investment

(Brown County, Wis.) – The Village of Denmark, in association with Brown County and private businesses, is announcing support for the creation of the Denmark Business Development Corridor, strategically located along Interstate 43.

“The Village of Denmark is proud to announce some exciting developments that will be taking place this spring.
