Republican Bill to Cut Taxes for Families Now Heads to Governor's Desk

[Madison, WI] – Moments ago, the Wisconsin State Senate, led by Republican lawmakers, passed a plan to reduce taxes for the state's middle-class families. The GOP-backed legislation, which cuts taxes on the average taxpayer by \$170 a year, will now go to Governor Tony Evers' desk to be signed into law. In response to the passage of the plan, the Republican Party of Wisconsin issued the following statement from Chairman Brad Courtney:
