

# Dallman campaign: Officially on ballot for 41st Assembly District August 11 primary election

Green Lake, WI. . . Former Green Lake County Republican Party Chairman and Candidate for the 41st State Assembly District, Alex Dallman, announced today that he has submitted the maximum number of 400 signatures to the Wisconsin Elections Commission and will appear on the ballot for the August 11th primary election.

“I am excited to announce that my name will officially appear on the ballot for the August 11th primary. With all of the support across the entire district, we were able to gather over 800 signatures, which is more than four times the amount necessary to appear on the ballot.” said Dallman. “As the State begins to reopen, I am excited and looking forward to getting out to events across the district in order to spread our growing campaign’s message and engage with voters.”

As of the June 1st 12:00pm report from the Wisconsin Elections Commission, Dallman is the only candidate who has submitted the maximum number of nomination signatures at 400. The 41st Assembly District is currently held by State Representative Joan Ballweg, who announced that she will be seeking election to the State Senate.
