

Dept. of Public Instruction: 10 Wisconsin students recognized with high national academic honor

MADISON — Ten Wisconsin students have been named semifinalists in the 2020 U.S. Presidential Scholars Program, a national honor recognizing the country's most distinguished graduating high school seniors.

"Each of these students has worked incredibly hard inside and outside of the classroom," State Superintendent Carolyn Stanford Taylor said. "This prestigious honor is a tribute to the many accomplishments of these students, and like their families, teachers, and educators, I am proud of our semifinalists and look forward to hearing about their future successes."

The Wisconsin students are among 621 national semifinalists selected by a review committee based on their achievements in various academic areas. Earlier this year, more than 5,600 students were recommended for the program out of the nation's 3.6 million graduating seniors.
