

Marquette University: National Sports Law Institute fall conference to focus on sports law faculty perspectives

MILWAUKEE — The National Sports Law Institute of Marquette University Law School will host its 31st annual Fall Conference, “Perspectives from a Sports Law Faculty,” virtually on Friday, Oct. 16, from noon to 5 p.m.

The conference will feature members of the Sports Law Program faculty at Marquette Law School, leading discussions and giving presentations on areas within their particular specialty.

Topics will include issues in college athletics, featuring a panel of faculty and alumni from Marquette Law School currently working in intercollegiate compliance; sexual harassment in college athletics; when a coach is terminated without cause; interstate taxation of professional athletes and federal taxation of player trades; and Olympic sports arbitration.
