

Meyers campaign: Announces re-election campaign for 74th Assembly district

Bayfield, WI – Representative Beth Meyers (D-Bayfield) announced today that she will run for re-election to the Wisconsin State Assembly. In announcing her candidacy, Meyers released the following statement:

“It has been an honor and a privilege to serve as your representative. For almost six years, I have been a voice for Northern Wisconsin, advocating for the unique challenges and needs of the 74th Assembly District, but I believe there is more we can accomplish together,” said Rep. Beth Meyers.

She was elected to the State Assembly in 2014 and serves as Minority Caucus Secretary. She served as a Member of Bayfield County Board of Supervisors from 2010-2015, representing District 1-Town of Russell and the Red Cliff reservation.
