

MPC: Marquette Law School pollster Charles Franklin to headline Newsmaker Lunch Hour

MILWAUKEE – Charles Franklin, Professor of Law and Public Policy and director of the Marquette Law School Poll, will be the featured guest at a virtual event set for noon on Wednesday, November 11. Franklin will analyze and discuss the November 3 general election for president as well as other national and local races, with a focus on Wisconsin voting results.
