Madison, WI - On February 27, 2020, the Wisconsin Department of Health Services released [Reported Induced Abortions in Wisconsin 2018](#), an annual publication of statistics on abortions performed in Wisconsin. Abortions in Wisconsin increased by 7% for the 2018 reporting year over 2017. Pro-Life Wisconsin offered the following:

Despite the ardent efforts of pro-lifers across Wisconsin, 406 more babies died from abortion in 2018 than in 2017.

That's how many babies were murdered in 2018 by abortion, as reported by the Wisconsin Department of Health Services today. 6,224!

With reliance on God, the author of all life, Pro-Life Wisconsin will ceaselessly labor until abortion is illegal and unthinkable. We pray for the day where no more babies die and no more mothers cry. We will continue to find new ways to encourage the pro-life community in Wisconsin to shake off apathy and recommit to justice for the most vulnerable.
