**MADISON, Wis.** — State Senator Tom Tiffany (R-Minocqua) released the following statement on Monday regarding his resignation from the Wisconsin State Senate:

**“Later today I will resign from the Wisconsin State Senate. I want to thank the people of the 12<sup>th</sup> Senate District for putting their faith in me to represent their voices in Madison. It has been an honor to work for them, and I am grateful for having the opportunity to serve in the Wisconsin Legislature.**

“When I was first elected to the State Assembly in 2010, lawmakers faced a \$3.6 billion budget deficit, taxes and fees were high and confidence was low for small business owners. Over the years, Legislative Republicans turned that deficit into a surplus, cut taxes by more than \$13 billion, froze tuition for hard-working families, defended our 2<sup>nd</sup> Amendment, and protected the unborn.
