

Van Orden campaign: Hosts Women's Roundtables, speaks at Debate Watch, and continues growing support

HAGER CITY, WI – After a dominant week on the campaign trail last week, Derrick Van Orden continued building support across the district.

After announcing a \$2 million commitment to supporting Derrick last week, the Congressional Leadership Fund [launched their second ad](#). It highlights Kind missing 138 votes in under 3 years, pay-to-play allegations, and his voting record as a rubber stamp for Nancy Pelosi.
