

WisOpinion poll: Should the U.S. Senate vote on Trump's Supreme Court nominee before the election?

President Donald Trump has indicated he will soon announce his U.S. Supreme Court nominee following the death of Justice Ruth Bader Ginsburg.

Four years ago, U.S. Sen. Ron Johnson, R-Oshkosh, called Supreme Court nominations in an election year “problematic.” But he told WisPolitics.com in a phone interview he favors filling the vacancy even in a scenario where the vote was during a lame-duck session after President Trump lost reelection and Dems had taken control of the Senate.

Meanwhile, U.S. Sen. Tammy Baldwin, D-Madison, who pushed for a vote on Merrick Garland's nomination to the court in 2016, President Obama's last year in office, says the Senate should follow the standard Senate Majority Leader Mitch McConnell, R-Ky., imposed four years ago of not filling a vacancy in an election year.

McConnell has committed to a vote, but hasn't said when.
