

WisOpinion Poll: What should the state do with a projected increase in tax revenue?

The Legislative Fiscal Bureau's latest projection suggests the state will take in \$818.2 million more in tax revenue through mid-2021.

Of that, \$409.1 million is slated for the rainy day fund, which is now expected to have a balance just north of \$1 billion by the end of the biennium.

The new revenue and other factors mean an additional \$451.9 million in the state's coffers.

And that's not all. The state had budgeted \$212 million to give Foxconn via tax credits, but the LFB expects the state to fork over something in the \$50 million to \$75 million range.
