

American Bridge: Despite benefits for Wisconsin, Ron Johnson says it's "pointless" to review bipartisan infrastructure deal, because "I'm not going to vote for the bill"

Despite its [expected benefits](#) for Wisconsin, **Ron Johnson has fully ruled out supporting the bipartisan infrastructure deal** he last week voted against advancing in the Senate — even though he's praised the bill as "[good](#)" (at least [twice](#)).

Earlier today, Johnson [told CNS News](#) **he believes it's "pointless" to find out what's in the bipartisan deal, because** — no matter what, he says — **"I'm not going to vote for the bill."**

That tracks with what Johnson [told WCLO radio](#) on Tuesday: **"I can't imagine a scenario in which I'm going to vote 'yes' on this thing."**

Since [June](#), Johnson has made clear that he will **put partisan politics first and do his best to "frustrate" and prevent passage of a bipartisan infrastructure deal** — even if it means working against communities across Wisconsin.
