KENOSHA – Former Wisconsin Supreme Court Justice Louis J. Butler proudly endorsed Angela Cunningham for Kenosha County Circuit Court Judge Branch 6.

Louis J. Butler stated, “Angela has the right experience and values to make a difference on the Kenosha County bench. Kenosha needs a diverse set of perspectives on the bench, and her background in social work, as a community leader, as a single mother, as a defense attorney, prosecutor, and guardian ad litem, and as a seeker of justice for all, make her the perfect choice to be Kenosha’s next judge. She has a history of community service and professional experience to match it. Angela wants to use her legal experience to continue serving her community as a judge.

Primary voting takes place on February 16, 2021, with ballots cast on April 6th for the general election.
