

Door County Economic Development Corporation: Launches “Creator’s Clue,” a game designed to get Door County students familiar with local manufacturers

Sturgeon Bay, WI – Students at Southern Door and Washington Island High Schools kicked off a month-long game playing Creator’s Clue—a game to help students learn more about manufacturing and their community.

Students were given clues to nine manufacturers and had to research companies and clues to try to determine who their Mystery Manufacturer was. For those students that guess correctly, they advance to create a promotional piece for the company, which is later judged and entered into a competition to receive cash prizes donated by Renard’s Cheese and Therma-Tron-X.

The game, which was created by the Door County Economic Development Corporation (DCEDC), is designed to get students engaged in the manufacturing sector, learn about their products and careers, learn some interesting facts about various companies, and develop research, human resource, speaking and presentation skills.

The game is the second game offered by DCEDC this fall. In October sixth grade students were given Fun Fact Trading Cards, designed by DCEDC and sponsored by Therma-Tron-X. The cards were developed for use in the classroom and students learned about the companies on the cards. Once students accumulate all the cards, they can play Go Manny!, also known as Go Manufacturer, or Go Fish. A new deck of cards will be created each year offering more fun facts about the county’s manufacturers.

All schools participated in the trading cards promotion, but only two high schools chose to participate in Creator's Clue.
