

# Gallagher tops Wisconsin House delegation in fundraising, cash on hand

U.S. Rep. Mike Gallagher, R-Allouez, topped Wisconsin's congressional delegation for money raised during the third quarter and cash on hand to end the period.

Gallagher [raised](#) \$500,441, spent \$111,362 and had nearly \$2.7 million in the bank.

His fundraising total included \$154,000 from PACs and a transfer of \$206,596 from his leadership PAC.

\*U.S. Rep. Bryan Steil, R-Janesville, [raised](#) \$439,750, including \$232,922 from PACs. He spent \$162,263 and finished the period with nearly \$1.2 million cash on hand.

\*U.S. Rep. Mark Pocan, D-Town of Vermont, [raised](#) \$148,389, spent \$84,362 and had just over \$1 million in the bank. He raised \$160,847 during the second quarter.

\*U.S. Rep. Ron Kind, [listed](#) \$101,615 in contributions during the three-month period. But the La Crosse Dem, who announced in August he wouldn't seek reelection, returned \$94,550 to donors. He finished September with nearly \$1.3 million in the bank.

\*U.S. Rep. Gwen Moore, D-Milwaukee, [raised](#) \$153,307, spent \$157,188 and had \$84,347 cash on hand.

\*U.S. Rep. Scott Fitzgerald, R-Juneau, [raised](#) \$123,276, spent \$122,108 and had

\$221,162 in the bank. Fitzgerald listed \$31,250 in PACs.

\*U.S. Rep. Glenn Grothman, R-Glenbeulah, [raised](#) \$146,135, spent \$119,151 and had \$473,940 in the bank. He continued to list \$139,110 in debts.

\*U.S. Rep. Tom Tiffany, R-Minocqua, [raised](#) \$91,944, spent \$127,372 and had \$129,352 in the bank.

Meanwhile, 3rd CD GOP candidate Derrick Van Orden [raised](#) nearly \$1.1 million during the quarter.

That was an uptick from the \$753,996 he raised during the second quarter, before Kind announced he wouldn't seek reelection.

His third-quarter haul included \$459,202 in unitemized contributions and \$22,000 from PACs.

Van Orden also spent \$429,911 and had more than \$1.2 million in the bank to end the quarter.
