DeForest, WI – The Wisconsin Laborers' District Council today hailed the historic passage of the \$1 trillion bipartisan infrastructure framework by the United States House of Representatives. This once-in-a-generation legislation will make new investments in the construction of roads and bridges, broadband investment, and water infrastructure. Members of the Wisconsin House delegation who voted for the infrastructure package included Representative Mark Pocan (WI-02), Representative Ron Kind (WI-03), and Representative Gwen Moore (WI-04).
