

Rep. Behnke: Evers vetoes parental control over education

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MADISON – State Representative Elijah Behnke (R-Oconto) issued the following statement in response to Governor Evers’ veto of Senate Bill 463 (SB 463):

“Parents should always have full control over their children’s education, plain and simple. This includes having access to the course curriculum and classroom materials that students will be exposed to. This access should be free and easy to utilize, allowing parents to monitor their children’s education and make changes when appropriate.”

“Senator Duey Stroebel and I authored SB 463 to ensure just that. This bill would’ve gone a long way towards making sure education doesn’t turn into indoctrination.”
