

Rep. Vining: Sworn in as 14th Assembly District representative for her second term & announces committee assignments

MADISON – State Representative Robyn Vining (D-Wauwatosa) was sworn into the Wisconsin State Assembly for her second term on Monday, December 28th by Governor Tony Evers in a virtual ceremony with her Democratic colleagues.

Today, Rep.
