

U.S. Rep. Gallagher, Sen. Cotton: Introduce Iran Sanctions Resolution

WASHINGTON, D.C. — Rep. Mike Gallagher (R-WI) and Senator Tom Cotton (R-AR) today led 42 members of Congress in introducing a [resolution](#) opposing efforts to lift sanctions on Iran. The members released the following joint statement after introduction:

“Until the Iranian regime has put an end to its nuclear-weapon program and no longer sponsors terrorists, the U.S. must maintain sanctions. Iran took advantage of weak policies during the Obama Administration, and President Biden must not repeat those same mistakes.”
