

U.S. Sen. Johnson: Joins resolution supporting parents' voices in education

WASHINGTON — On Thursday, U.S. Sen. Ron Johnson (R-Wis.) joined Sen. Rick Scott (R-Fla.), Leader Mitch McConnell (R-Ky.) and 29 of their Republican colleagues in introducing a [resolution](#) supporting parents' rights to be fully and actively involved in their children's education.
