

WIPPS: Hmong and Hispanic Communication Network releases COVID-19 family testimonial video

[The Hmong and Hispanic Communication Network \(H2N\)](#) has released a 4-minute video featuring a central Wisconsin families' experience withstanding the pandemic, and why they chose to receive a COVID-19 vaccination.

In the video, the Arneson/McColley family explains how they endured the pandemic and protected one another, while sharing a home. The family consists of an older generation with health issues and 18-21-year-olds who attend school and work in healthcare.
